This law required the EPA to develop regulations which provide a comprehensive framework for addressing asbestos problems in public and private elementary and secondary schools. On October 30, 1987, the EPA published the Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule (40 CFR Part 763 Subpart E). This new rule requires all public and private elementary and secondary schools to inspect for friable and nonfriable asbestos, develop asbestos management plans that address asbestos hazards in school buildings, and implement response actions in a timely fashion. This rule went into effect in December of 1987.

Carbondale New School conducted and passed a complete inspection of its facilities on June 16, 1989 and continues to complete the re-inspection process every three years. The results of this inspection have been included in a management plan, which is available in the administrative office of Carbondale New School during normal business hours, without cost or restriction, for inspection by representatives of the EPA and the State, and the public, including teachers, other school personnel and their representatives, and parents. Carbondale New School may charge a reasonable cost to make copies of the management plan.


