AHERA 3-YEAR ACM-MATERIAL REINSPECTION BID PROPOSAL

MEAD Environmental Associates will conduct the required AHERA THREE-YEAR REINSPECTION of homogeneous areas containing asbestos or assumed to contain asbestos, according to the protocol set forth in the Federal Register, October 30, 1987, 40 CFR Part 763.85(b).

We are providing an individually prepared bid for each Local Education Agency (LEA) for this reinspection because each LEA has a different number and size of homogeneous areas which must be reinspected.

Following is the list of schools in Carbondale New Schoolwhich were inspected in 1989, 1992, 1995, and 1998, and were found to have homogeneous areas containing asbestos contaminated material.

The reinspection will cover:

1. One (1) school

Carbondale New School

represented on 5-30-01 by Douid Roth.

2. Eight (8) homogeneous areas of known or assumed ACM

Any areas which have been removed, or partially removed, will also require reinspection. Homogeneous areas that have been removed will not require attention in future reinspections. If there have been any changes in the building status, i.e. the sale of a building or purchase of a building, please contact us.

Our accredited inspector will need access to these buildings and to each room which has, or did have, asbestos containing materials at the time of the original inspection. The services of a custodian to provide guidance in quickly locating rooms and to provide access to commonly restricted areas will be appreciated. Commonly restricted areas are administrative offices, vault, coaches' offices, tunnels, crawl spaces, closets, etc. The estimated amount of time required to complete the inspection is based upon the assumption that the school will provide a person who has access to all needed areas.

Each individual area must be addressed at the time of reinspection and in the final reports.



Samples will be collected only at the request of the LEA. Sample analysis is not included in the proposal. The charge for sample collection, documentation and report preparation is \$14.60 per sample, with three (3) samples being required for each kind of material. The charge for sample analysis is \$10.00 per sample, giving a total of \$24.60 per sample and a total of \$73.80 for each material to be declared No Asbestos Detected. Floor tile and mastic (adhesive) are separate samples.

MEAD Environmental Associates will provide for each principal's and superintendent's office:

- on-site reinspection
- reinspection reports
- management plan changes when necessary

for the sum of \$250.00 \$175

Please note that this charge is the same as for the last reinspection. It would be very helpful for us if your district could provide maintenance escort early in the morning or late in the afternoon to enable our inspector to get in a long day's work. Doing so enables us to get to many more districts in a shorter time frame. We do pay our inspector for overtime.

The invoice will be mailed to the LEA with the inspection report/management plan. This price includes future phone consultations at <u>no-charge</u> with no limit in number or length of calls, until the next reinspection deadline, March, 2004. Our phone number is 1-800-659-3329.

P.S. If your school is anticipating renovations before the next reinspection in 2004, prudence would dictate sample collection from assumed materials in the proposed work area. All samples must be collected by a licensed inspector, so the sampling charges would be much less during the reinspection than having an inspector return at a future date.
