From the Associate Director's Desk

I would like to start by saying thank you to Tristan, Jessica, Carla, and Dan for helping out with the water issues in the modular building. The floor is fixed and the leak is no longer. I would also like to say thank you to Jim King for cleaning up the playground trees and limbs after the ice storm. It sure looks good. The balance beam is wonderful! A final thank you to EZ Rental for the trencher that was used over fall beautification. The playground looks great and will only be getting better.

Jessica and Courtney are working hard on getting re-certification for Nature Explore. I'm looking forward to some of the changes. Annie has already provided beautiful signs for the PreK/K fort area and the 1st-8th fort area. Thanks Annie!

I would like to remind everyone of the electronics policy. The policy regarding electronics is as follows: Electronics can be used on Friday and/or after school indoor recess. Cell phones are included as electronics. Please make sure that all students are following this CNS policy.

From the January Board Meeting

The January board meeting was very productive (and it should have been, it lasted 4 hours!). We discussed setting a policy for student dismissals so that it would be more transparent and give the school guidelines. We are still searching for a new accountant to assist us with taxes. The board is also considering changing the policy for sending accounts to collections based on total amount owed rather than 90 days past due. The board also approved new tuition rates for full day for the 2017-18 school year. Please be on the lookout for that communication.

Finance Committee

The finance committee has completed the tuition proposal for 2017/2018 school year and is Board approved. This information was sent by email to the corporation on February 27th. We have put together a salary proposal to present to the Board on February 2nd. We meet the Thursday before every Board meeting. Next meeting is February 23rd at 4pm.

From the Buildings and Grounds Committee

The building and grounds committee met Thursday the fifth of January at 8:15pm. Items discussed included a need to upgrade the smoke alarm system throughout the main building as some rooms do not have them. Also, discussed was a need for wood chips and/or sawdust for the playground to help with the mud problem. Lastly, it was brought up that a parent would like to donate zoysia grass plugs for the soccer field. No further meetings of the building and grounds committee are scheduled for the remainder of the school year.

From the Curriculum Committee

On Friday 1/27 the curriculum committee met and elected Sarah Curtis and Maryanne Felkins as co-chairs moving forward. We discussed the results of the parent survey thus far, and made plans to discuss the most pressing issues and come up with possible plans at our next meeting which is scheduled on Friday, March 3rd at 3:15pm. We had 19 responses to discuss at January's meeting, and we decided to ask the office to distribute reminder emails to parents and attach a deadline for responses of February 28th. Sarah is going to work up a draft of a questionnaire for teachers asking for input on their needs from curriculum committee. Shannon is going to coordinate with the playground supervisor on using the math blocks we got from Dr. Bu for possible after-school activities and Dr. Wu has offered to help with training.

From the Diversity Committee

The diversity survey received 19 responses. The committee is processing the data and producing a report. The next committee meeting will be Friday, Feb 10, 2:30-3:30pm.

From the Communications Committee

This month we met with Mavis Adjel, a professor of marketing at SIUC. We asked her for input on how we can improve our image in the community, raise awareness about the school, and hopefully recruit new students. We worked on simplifying the brochure, and Sarah will create a new mock-up based on the old design but with some minor verbiage changes that Mavis and the committee agreed would be more positively received. We also discussed where to put brochures in order to reach newcomers to Carbondale—some ideas include hospitals and pediatricians who are both potentially new to the community and talk regularly with parents, and realtors. Mavis suggested that we offer potential locations for our brochures a sort of trade to display their information at our school. We also discussed language that might be off-putting to people who don't know anything else about our school—notably "independent" can signal "not enough supervision" or "kids teach themselves" or "kids do what they want" so we discussed different ways to communicate our educational philosophy in ways that will be more attractive to typical parents. The main goal for our next meeting (Wednesday, March 8th at 5pm) is to increase consistency in our language across media (FB, Youtube, website, brochure etc.) so that there isn't a sense of confusion for possibly interested families.

From the Fundraisers Committee

The second round of LG letters has been sent out, as well an additional 35 or so hand delivered to businesses not on the followup list for previous donations. Follow up phone calls will be made in about 2 weeks.

LG committee is looking into possible venues.

We have received the catalogs for the fit and fresh fundraiser but since the shipping was delayed we will be extending the deadline for turn in to the office to Feb 10th.

The Polka Dot Paint Party will be March 25th from 10-1. I will make tickets available for purchase about 1 month prior to event.
