Dear Parents:

This is a report of what grades 4-8 students have been learning in our Spanish class:

- *Basic greetings and polite words*: how to greet and introducing yourself.
- *The Alphabet in Spanish*: learning the names and the pronunciation of the letters.
- *Numbers*: all numbers from 0 - 100.
- *México's Independence Day*: Our "Dia De La Independencia" (15th of Sep., 1810)
- *Plurals and Singular nouns in Spanish*: the three rules for plural nouns.
- *Masculine and feminine*: the gender of the nouns and adjectives in Spanish.
- *The Definite Articles in Spanish*: El, La, Los, Las, Un, Uno, Unas, Unos.
- *How to use the articles*: singular and plural nouns.
- *Expressions*: common and basic Spanish expressions to use in a conversation.
- *Day of the Dead*: This was our October project and they did an amazing job.
- *Days of the Week*
- *Months of the Year*
- *Seasons of the Year*
- *Vocabulary*

After learning each subject, we practiced with different games: bingo, matching cards, memory cards, board games. Also, the students were assigned homework to keep practicing. The students have been assessed with a written and verbal quiz. They did their self-evaluations about academic work and behaviors in our Spanish class. We will start a reading program to improve their pronunciation.
